

Where can I bring recyclable material that cannot be placed in the Borough Council recycle bags?

Please bring glass to your nearest bottle bank. These are located at the following sites:

Gaol Road,
St. Mary's Car Park,
Wolfe Tone St. Car Park
Loughboy Shopping Centre,
Market Yard,
St. Canice's Church,
Lidl Car Park.

Make compost with your kitchen and garden waste.

The Recycling Facility at Dunmore can accept the following recyclable materials:

PAPER (Mixed Paper, Light Cardboard, Corrugated Cardboard)

PLASTICS (Light Plastic Packaging, Plastic Bottles)

TIMBER (Hinges, Handles etc. removed, no mixture of glass or metal)

METAL (Mixed Metals)

GLASS (White, Green and Brown)

STEEL FOOD CANS

ALUMINIUM DRINKS CANS

TEXTILES (Clean Clothes, Sheets, Shoes)

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (Including Aerosols, Medicines, Fluorescent Tubes, Paints)

PRIMARY BATTERIES

A charge of €3.50 per car (Householders only) will apply.

Trailers or Horse Boxes will be weighed and charged accordingly.

Specialised Recyclable Materials

WASTE OILS cost €2 subject to a maximum of 10 litres

LEAD ACID BATTERIES, standard - i.e. up to 12kg (€5 per item)

LEAD ACID BATTERIES, tractor - i.e. up to 30kg (€10 per item)

NOTE: Larger Batteries (e.g. Back up power supply 85kg) not acceptable.

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment including Fridges and Freezers are accepted at Dunmore free of charge.

All items accepted at the Civic Amenity Site are from Householders only.

WHAT IS A 'KERBSIDE COLLECTION'?

A Kerbside Collection is a separate collection for clean and dry recyclable waste. This involves separating dry recyclables (see list) from ordinary household waste. Your dry recyclables are put into the green recyclable bag and your ordinary refuse is put into the yellow ordinary refuse bag. These bags can be purchased from your local shop (see list).

WHY?

It is in the interest of everyone to recycle and reduce the amount going to landfill and Kilkenny Borough Council is committed to recycling more waste. This collection will make it easier to recycle more and reduce the amount we send to landfill.

How?

Check the collection timetable and the calendar in this brochure to establish your collection day. On the day appointed for recyclable collection leave out your sorted dry recyclables in the appropriate (GREEN) bag. On the day appointed for ordinary refuse collection leave out your ordinary refuse (less dry recyclables) in the appropriate (YELLOW) bag. The refuse truck will collect only the appropriate bag on the appropriate day/week. It is important to leave the bags outside your gate/on the footpath, before 8.00 am on the morning of the collection. **DO NOT LEAVE BAGS OUT OVERNIGHT.**

IMPORTANT POINTS TO REMEMBER:

- Recyclable material that is wet or has been contaminated with food waste cannot be recycled. If wet and/or contaminated, it should be placed in the yellow bag.
- Recyclable items not listed in this literature should not be put in the recycle bag.
- Items should be clean with the lids removed, these can also be included for recycling.
- Ensure that your yellow and green collection bags are securely tied when placed out for collection as wet recyclable material can not be collected.
- Refuse charges that remain outstanding for 2003 and previous years are still payable to Kilkenny Borough Council. Borough Council Refuse Collectors will only collect the special Yellow and Green Bags on Yellow and Green Weeks as per the collection calendar.
- Do not leave your yellow refuse bag and green recycle bag out for collection on the same day as only one will be collected.

WHEN WILL IT BE COLLECTED?

The Collection will take place on a fortnightly basis. Dry Recyclables and Residual/Ordinary refuse will be collected on alternate weeks.

Please check the enclosed calendar which indicates your collection day. Use a compost bin or wormery to make compost from your garden and kitchen waste.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

SHOULD I USE A DIFFERENT BAG FOR DIFFERENT TYPES OF RECYCLABLE WASTE?

No. The same bag can be used for all dry recyclables listed. The materials are taken to a facility where they are sorted into the different types.

WHEN SHOULD I LEAVE MY BAGS OUT FOR COLLECTION?

Bags will be collected on alternate weeks; Recyclable in the green bag one week and ordinary waste in the yellow bags on the following week. Please remember to check your calendar. It is important that you start separating your waste the week before the collection starts By recycling you can reduce your refuse charges.

DO I NEED TO ATTACH A TAG?

No. The charge for the bags covers the cost of collection and disposal.

HOW MANY BAGS CAN I LEAVE OUT?

You can leave out as many as you need to. Remember the bags must be the special Borough Council Yellow

refuse and Green recycle bags, on the appropriate weeks. The recycle bags should only contain dry, clean recyclable material.

ARE PLASTIC BAGS RECYCLABLE?

Plastic Shopping bags etc. are not acceptable in the collection. Please reuse your plastic shopping bags. The yellow and green bags used in your collection service have built in biodegradable enzymes that ensure that your collection bags are environmentally friendly. The sleeve wrapper from your green bag can be placed into the green recycle bag to be recycled.

WHY ISN'T GLASS INCLUDED IN THE RECYCLING COLLECTION?

Once broken, different glass colours are difficult to separate and furthermore broken glass can destroy the paper recycling process. You should continue to bring your glass bottles and jars to your nearest bottle banks.

TOP TIPS:

Rinse out and squash all containers and cartons.
 Bring all glass to the bottle banks located throughout the city (see back page for detailed locations).
 Remove lids from plastic bottles and then include them with your recyclables. Remember that all this waste is sorted by hand and every effort should be made to reduce any danger to the staff at the sorting plant.
 No hazardous or biological material (syringes, nappies, bloodied wipes, etc.) should be included.

BAGS THAT ARE TOO HEAVY OR RECYCLABLE BAGS THAT HAVE BEEN CONTAMINATED WITH WET, SOILED OR FOOD WASTE, WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.
